Open Letter to Vietnam's Leaders to Oppose the Imprisonment of Trương Huy San (also known as Huy Đức)

Dear Honorable Sirs and Madams:

We write as academics, journalists, diplomats, and researchers with an enduring interest in Vietnam to express our serious concern about the detention of Truong Huy San also known as Huy Đức, a prominent writer, historian, and investigative reporter. In addition to his scholarship and journalism, Huy Đức is widely admired for his environmental activism, and his efforts to promote post-Vietnam War reconciliation.

According to reports in state media, the police arrested Huy Đức on June 1, 2024 under Article 331 of the Vietnamese penal code for "abusing rights of freedom and democracy to infringe upon the interests of the state." He was not permitted contact with lawyers or family members during the three months following his arrest. Public concern about his condition is intense.

In the absence of an official explanation for why precisely Huy Đức has been detained, many people have speculated that his arrest was triggered by comments he posted on social media about the political direction of the country. But Vietnam's Constitution explicitly protects citizens' rights to lodge complaints against state agencies and individual authorities (Constitution of the Socialist Republic of Vietnam [revised 2013], Article 30). The Constitution also guarantees citizens' rights to freedom of speech and the press (Article 25).

Since these are the very rights that Huy Đức is exercising, he should not have been arrested or detained.

It is also wrong that Huy Đức is still in jail. After more than three months of imprisonment, he has neither been prosecuted nor convicted of any crime. Vietnam's Constitution stipulates that someone who may have committed a crime is presumed innocent until proven guilty in a court of law (Article 31).

These rights are also stated in the United Nations Declaration of Human Rights, which the Socialist Republic of Vietnam's government has formally endorsed. Indeed, Vietnam is now a

member of the United Nations Human Rights Council that supports and administers that Declaration.

We call on the Vietnamese government to abide by the provisions of its constitution and the international treaties that it has signed and release Huy Đức immediately.

We also strongly urge the government to stop harassing, intimidating, or otherwise persecuting persons who peacefully express their views or opinions.
